

Make sure kitty is wearing ID in case of escape. A scared cat may become lost, and updated microchip registratio plus collar are the fastest ways home.





Be careful with Halloween decor. Not manufactured to be safely used as cat toys, decor may have loose pieces or be made of unhealthy materials. Use a flameless candle in your jack-o-lantern.

Dress kitty in costumes for holiday photos safely. Watch for signs of distress. Don't overdo it if kitty gets upset. Be sure costume aren't too tight to draw a deep breath or obscure kitty's eyes.



GIVE THEM A CHANCE

Hallie Hill thanks all of our adopters for giving our special animals the chance they deserve! We love you!

Here are some ideas for enrichment activities which can help your dog engage in different ways. Each of the categories cater to the types of stimulation dogs need to help them feel satisfied and fulfilled.

Try to pick 1 activity in each of the categories to try so that your dog can experience different sensations everyday.

Try not to do the same thing more than 3 times in the week to keep enrichment interesting for your dog even if they love it. Activities which you do regularly can become part of a routine and can loose their enrichment factor

Modify the enrichment to suit your dog's level of engagement. Remember to start easy with a new activity.

Enrichment should always be fun, not frustrating.

FOOD

- Scatter feeding in grass
- Scatter feeding snuffle mat
- Hide dinner around house - KONG Wobbler
- KONG Classic
- Cardboard boxes
- Toliet paper parcels
- Play catch with food
- Food in plastic bottle
- Food on Lickimat - Hide food under cups/pots
- Hide food under cones
- String paper cups together
- Hide food in an old toy
- Hide food in rope toy
- Hide food in an old t-shirt
- Hide food in a twisted towel
- Puzzle feeder
- Slow feeder bowl
- Bob for food in bucket/pool
- New natural chew
- Taster menu of new foods
- Lickimat Wobble bowl
- Food dispensing toy
- Snuffle box feeding

COGNITIVE

- Teach play dead
- Link different tricks together
- Work on coordination
- Practice loose lead walking
- Practice settle & wait cues
- Learn clicker training
- Practice name recognition
- Teach your dog how to put their toys away
- Teach the middle cue
- Teach how to retrieve an
- Teach the Bucket Game
- Teach leave it & drop cues - Join online trick groups
- Work on door manners
- Practice recall somewhere
- Teach a reliable emergency stop cue
- Teach your dog a new word
- Take your training to a new spot to practice known cues
- Try dog parkour

SOCIAL

- Play tug
- Give your dog a massage
- Brush your dog
- Play retrieve
- Cuddle your dog

- Play with a flirt pole


